### **Brittanye Morris Responds to Legal Challenge Following Primary Victory in Fort Bend County Precinct 4 Race**

**Fort Bend County, TX** — Brittanye Morris, who secured a first-place finish in the March 2 Democratic Primary for Fort Bend County Commissioner, Precinct 4, is responding to a legal challenge filed by a defeated opponent seeking to re-enter the race.

Morris's campaign states that the challenge is an unlawful attempt to overturn certified election results and bypass voter decision-making.

*"The voters made their choice clear on March 3," said Morris. "Attempts to reverse that outcome through the courts are not only baseless but undermine confidence in our elections."*

According to the campaign, Texas election law clearly prohibits defeated candidates from regaining ballot access under these circumstances, and Morris's eligibility for the runoff election remains valid.

In a rare bipartisan move, two prominent Texas election attorneys—representing both Democratic and Republican interests—have joined together to defend Morris's candidacy.

*"This case is about protecting the integrity of elections and ensuring voters—not political maneuvering—decide outcomes," Morris added.*

The legal challenge comes ahead of the May 26 runoff election, when voters will determine the next Fort Bend County Commissioner for Precinct 4.

Morris's campaign is urging voters to participate in the runoff and reaffirm the results of the primary.

*"Elections are decided at the ballot box," Morris said. "And that's exactly where this decision belongs."*
